Virginia Aquarium's Beloved Otter, Tippy, Diagnosed with Lymphoma

(Virginia Beach, VA) – This week, the Virginia Aquarium & Marine Science Center's elderly North American river otter, Tippy, was diagnosed with intestinal lymphoma after receiving biopsy results from an endoscopic procedure. The team has developed a treatment plan.

A diagnostic procedure was conducted on September 12 after Aquarium staff observed signs that the 16-year-old otter's weight was decreasing despite having a normal appetite. The veterinary team, joined by a veterinary internal medicine specialist, was able to utilize an endoscope to examine and sample his digestive tract, which led to the diagnosis of intestinal lymphoma. Tippy is currently receiving medications to support his digestive system and ensure he is comfortable. He will begin a targeted treatment for lymphoma with oral medication. The care team is hopeful Tippy will improve upon treatment, but he will be monitored closely for overall condition, increase in weight, and continued quality of life.

Tippy arrived at the Virginia Aquarium on January 10, 2008, and Aquarium staff has cared for him for nearly 16 years. According to his trainers, Tippy is an inquisitive animal whose favorite food is herring and favorite item to interact with is fake kelp.

"Our animal care and veterinary staff have an unmatched passion and knowledge for the work they do," said Cynthia Spanoulis, Director of the Virginia Aquarium. "We are dedicated to providing high quality care for our animals, and Tippy's diagnosis is an example of this care."
